Peter Van der Perre (ITS.be) welcomes all participants and highlights the importance of this workshop. After 3 presentations, a debate is foreseen to discuss the evolution of ticketing systems at the level of the public transport operators (PTO's) and the private MaaS-providers. Goal of this workshop is to build up knowledge, share insights and discuss how to move to "the best' user experience in the future.

1.

Pierre-Paul Bertiaux (New Mobility Consulting) gives an overview of existing ticketing systems globally and highlights new projects that are interesting for Belgium (see <u>presentation</u>).

Pierre-Paul's presentation started with some key definitions such as:

- contract types (1. tickets/multi-tickets, 2. season passes, 3. pay as you go (value contracts)),
- different integration levels (1. unique wallet buy tickets separately, 2. unique wallet buy tickets from different operators in 1 transaction, 3. pay as you go across operators remaining price-addition, 4. fixed price multimodal ticket/Netflix/MaaS)
- from card-based, to account-based with cache to Account-Based Ticketing.

He talked about 3 roles:

- operators/service providers
- account managers
- integrators/MaaS providers

as well as about different technologies:

- cards
- smartphones
- ABT
- MaaS
- Blockchain.

The key user expectations he covered are:

- Seamless travel
- Best price
- Flexibility
- Transparancy

And concluded how the market is evolving from a captive market to a market of users by choice. This is the great opportunity for all operators and especially PT operators and their ticketing systems will need to be re-thought for this huge new market.

In sum, ticketing evolution has gone from: paper tomagnetic and smart card to the current hybrid solutions (card, EMV, mobile phone, ...) will all be moving to fully digital and account-based systems.

Michel Genot, head of ticketing at MIVB/STIB gives an overview of the roadmap regarding ticketing



at MIVB/STIB (see <u>presentation</u>). The MIVB/MIVB is open to co-operation with MaaS-providers since Q4 2018 (also mentioned in their new <u>management contract</u> published a few days after this workshop) and is already working with 3 MaaS-providers in testing fase. In 2019 it will be studies how to go full digital (option without Mobib card). In principle end 2019 NFC-enabled payment.

Bernard van der Lande (head of new business development) shares the Worldline perspective and offer for future ticketing systems (see <u>presentation</u>). They see converging markets between ticketing and payment and provide a platform and/or engage themselves a settlement enabler between cooperating mobility providers (eg UK).

To open the discussion, Peter Van der Perre highlights the 3 most important topics (see <u>presentation</u>):

- A. Public transport steps towards common user experience for end-users?
- B. Public transport & MaaS-providers better cooperation possible?
- C. Policy level what can cities/regions/the federal level do

Q&A:

- MIVB: there is no common roadmap between the 4 PTO's, but we follow the same road;
- De Lijn: we align in terms of technology, approach and ecosystem. There is no standardized open ticketing API for the 4 PTO's, but we're open to discuss this within the BE MaaS alliance;
- MIVB: ticketing is bigger than Belgium (eg TGV-travel);
- De Lijn: Ticketing is a tactical discussion, strategically on the policy level it should be clear that PT gets a higher priority than for instance cars;
- All best-practices between PTO's and MaaS-providers should be known and shared. Working towards a MaaS tier standard contract;
- FOD Mobility & Transport: we are leading a new EU working group on ticketing;
- Need for strong vision to make the business model work (today commission at De Lijn is 3,3% at MIVB it is 0%).

In conclusion:

General co-operation between PTO's towards a common user experience:

- regional autonomy has to be respected
- different technologies are being used and explored which is good

Concrete:

- all moving to EMV which is in principle a common and interoperable technology
- open ticketing APIs that are likely to be standardised (at the European level?)
- products: digital Jump ticket is being looked into
- cross-border developments are important and being followed
- (Mobib/Calypso standard offers opportunities, common exchange platform exist for four



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operators (Sensy) that can be upgraded for account-based ticketing)

Suggestions:

- harmonise contracts for MaaS providers
- instead of governance body by PT operators most likely public-private governance is necessary, inlcuiding all players on an equal basis and with extended functionality (eg calculating common fares).

Clearly interoperable ticketing is a part of overall mobility policy – it is just one element in a complete chain that enables multimodality and MaaS.
